

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FEBRUARY 21, 2019

Session approved recommendations from the Clerk:

- Dismiss Grace Carpenter (Goeldner) from GFPC to Moody Methodist Church in Galveston, Texas by letter of transfer.
- Remove J. Pat Wise from the roll of GFPC.

Session approved recommendations from the Board of Trustees:

- Amounts of \$3,000 for the 2019 Caroline Dickerson scholarship and \$13,100 for the Kate Rieves scholarships.
- An amount of \$3,200 for the Goldsmith scholarship.

Session approved recommendations from Christian Education:

- June 24-28, 2019 as VBS week.
- April 20 from 10-11:30 A.M. for the Easter Eggstravaganza.
- April 28 for a Variety Show with proceeds going for our children/youth Camps and Conferences.

Session approved recommendations from Mission and Outreach:

- Hold a blood drive on September 18, 2019.
- Sending a \$200 donation (money to come from the Compassion Fund) and the undesignated cash from every 5th Sunday to the Ministerial Alliance Transient Fund (after the Ryle Fund has reaches its goal). *See below

Session approved Property's request to change the deductible on GFPC's property insurance from \$2,500 per claim to a deductible of \$10,000 for wind and hail damage and \$5,000 for all other losses. This will save GFPC \$1,314 per year in property insurance costs.

Session approved Deacons/In-Touch Ministry recommendation to use \$150 from the Memorial Fund to purchase a memorial brick to be placed at Weatherford College.

*At our February session meeting, the session voted that our 5th Sunday undesignated cash offerings go to the Ministerial Alliance Transient Fund. This fund is set up through the Ministerial Alliance and the Weatherford Police Department to provide one night housing for transient folks coming through Parker County. This fund is solely supported by local churches and is given out at the Police department if ministers have folks come to the church seeking lodging. Thank you for your contributions to this fund and for helping us help those who are in need. If you have any questions please contact David.




