#### PASTOR ASHLEY'S PEACE

Happy August, Everyone! The summer is flying by. I can't believe we are already to August. June and July were packed with preparing for Guatemala and then heading down to serve with friends old and new for a week. Our group was made up of 18 individuals, two of whom came along after hearing about it here at Grace First! During VBS the children (and many adults) donated books and money to go toward a library project that Mission Co-Worker Debbie Welch has implemented in Coban, Guatemala. I was able to take an entire carry on size roller bag full of books, with an additional \$420 for Debbie to purchase more books! Additionally, \$100 was given toward construction cost on the church we've been working on completing for two years, over 80 cards were decorated and signed with messages in Spanish from our young people, and Colin Rosché wanted to share his love of coloring by sending multiple packs of crayons and coloring books.

It was an honor to represent you all, along with Katy Smith (granddaughter of Nancy and Dave Deison), as we presented these offerings to our friends. The books will be put to great use in classrooms that have no storybooks, the notecards will be shared with all the children of the Monte Carmelo Church in Limon Sur, the cash was used to purchase roofing materials for the new church building, and the school in Limon Sur (that serves children who attend one of three Presbyterian Churches in the rural village) happily received the coloring books and crayons. They remarked that they didn't have either of these for their preschool age children.

Thank you to all of you who have embraced my love for Guatemala, and especially for the people of Guatemala whom I have loved for the past six years. I am looking forward to exploring how the Grace First community may consider investing into the lives of our Presbyterian brothers and sisters there, and reaching communities that desperately need simple, basic resources.

As we head into a new school year and look toward our fall church programming I hope you all will consider ways to continue the support of education by contributing to our backpack program, becoming a LOGOS volunteer, or helping out with numerous opportunities to serve the children and youth of GFPC.

#### FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

What a fantastic month of July! Exhausting but fantastic!

The other day at our staff meeting, Ashley asked us what the highs and lows of our life were since we last met. Without a doubt or hesitation, I said, "My high definitely was Synod!"

For those of you who do not know what Synod is, it is a weeklong high school conference held at Tulsa University for youth from Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas, Louisiana, and this year Missouri. Churches bring their youth and sponsors and almost immediately they are split up into different small groups that become your "Synod family." While it is a little unnerving for some youth, because they must meet new people, the small group quickly becomes their new church family for the week.

GFPC had four youth, three sponsors, and three staff members attend Synod this year. Our own Eryn Williams was on the planning team along with nine other youth. The planning team develops the theme, songs, energizers, and skits, basically they lead the conference. What a joy it was to see Eryn lead energizers and be a part of the planning of the best youth conference around!

Synod truly is a life changing experience for the youth who attend and even the adults who participate. This conference is one that I look forward to each year with great joy and anticipation. If you have been, you know what I am talking about. If you have never been, you can rest assured we will continue to go and I encourage you to go as a sponsor so you can experience the Presbyterian youth of today as they lead and develop into the future leaders of the Presbyterian church.

#### & OUTREACH MISSION BACKPACK PROGRAM

Across the country, teachers and school nurses have found that in some instances, Monday morning comes and they are forced to compete against hunger for the attention of their students. More than 18 million children qualify for free or reduced price meals through the National School Lunch Program, the fuel that they need to get them through the week. What happens to these children when they go home over the weekend?

Churches all around have adopted this Backpack Program to meet the needs of the children. Here is how it works:

A school is chosen to serve and the school determines how many children are in need. We have partnered with Wright Elementary and will provide packs for several children. Last year we provided 22 packs per week.

Disposable backpacks are purchased for the children to put the non-perishable foods in. Each week the packs are filled with 3 daily servings for 2 days (the weekend) The packs are dropped off at the school on Thursday or Friday, at which time the school Counselor gives backpacks to the children.

The Mission & Outreach Ministry is collecting the following items to fill backpacks (individual packets only):

Fruit Juice, Mac-n-Cheese, Oatmeal, Canned Vegetables, Peanut Butter & Jelly, Pudding Cups, Raisins, Trail Mix, Vienna Sausage, Cocoa Mix, Popcorn
