CHURCH MATTERS - DECEMBER 15, 2017

Last evening on December 14, 2017, the Council of Grace First Presbyterian Church met, prayed, discussed, and adopted the following two actions. The Council asked its Moderator, Rev. Dr. Edie Gause, and its Clerk, Jill Bray, to convey to you the following. If you know of someone who does not receive email communications, please print this off and give to them. Thank you.

Two Scriptures come to mind as we consider these actions: From Proverbs 3:5 (The Message)

Trust God from the bottom of your heart; don't try to figure out everything on your own.

From Matthew 22:19-21, the question about paying taxes.

"Show me the coin used for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?" They answered, "The emperor's." Then he said to them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's."

The first action the Council took concerns the immediate need for security and safety for our congregation during worship. As soon as arrangements are secure with the Weatherford Police Department, the church will pay for a trained, off-duty officer with a marked patrol car to be in the church parking lot and generally present outside the building during Sunday morning activities. This is a highly recommended deterrent. We also recommend that you get to know our protectors and help children know the friendliness of our officers as well as their protective role.

The Council also commended the Deacons for their work securing the building during morning worship. While you worship, a couple of Deacons are diligently watching. These actions are the first steps towards a comprehensive security plan for our facility that a sub-group of the Deacons is working towards. You will continue to hear more about this plan in the coming months.

The second action concerns both respect and security for those on our prayer and concerns list. In keeping with the spirit of HIPPA law, Council voted the following:

The Cares and Concerns publicized by Grace First, both on paper (bulletin, newsletter, etc.) and electronically (Church Matters, etc.) will be limited to the name of the person needing prayer and that no further information be given, unless requested by the individual or an immediate family member.

Secure in the knowledge that God knows our needs before we pray and that our prayer is supportive, we ask our staff, our Deacons, and our worshippers to follow this guideline.


