### Call to Worship (Responsive)

## **Prayer of Invocation**

The "you/your" mentioned in every stanza is never identified, but this 1979 hymn is clearly a corporate prayer to God on behalf of the diverse congregation who have assembled for worship, longing to be transformed and used as God's witnesses and for God's purposes.

### Call to Confession

Trusting in God's promise of salvation, let us confess our sin and repent as we pray together the prayer of confession printed in your bulletin followed by your own silent prayer.

## Prayer of Confession (Unison)

We profess to be disciples, but we are not willing to bear the cost of discipleship. We affirm the virtue of self-denial, but we indulge our selfish desires and seek earthly gain. Forgive us, we pray free us for sincere repentance.

# Affirmation of Faith (Unison)

Confession of Belhar 10.7-10.8

### **WE BELIEVE**

(Isaiah 42:1-7)

that God has revealed God's self as the one who wishes to bring about justice and true peace among people;

(Luke 6:20-26)

that God, in a world full of injustice and enmity, is in a special way the God of the destitute, the poor and the wronged

(Luke 4:16-19)

that God calls the church to follow God in this; for God brings justice to the oppressed and gives bread to the hungry;

(Luke 7:22)

that God frees the prisoner and restores sight to the blind;

(Psalm 146)

that God supports the downtrodden, protects the stranger, helps orphans and widows and blocks the path of the ungodly;

(James 1:27)

that for God pure and undefiled religion is to visit the orphans and the widows in their suffering;

(Micah 6:8)

that God wishes to teach the church to do what is good and to seek the right;

(Amos 5:14-15, 23-24)

that the church must therefore stand by people in any form of suffering and need, which implies, among other things, that the church must witness against and strive against any form of injustice, so that justice may roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream;

(Psalm 82:1-5)

that the church as the possession of God must stand where the Lord stands, namely against injustice and with the wronged;

(Leviticus 19:15)

that in following Christ the church must witness against all the powerful and privileged who selfishly seek their own interests and thus control and harm others.

# THEREFORE, WE REJECT ANY IDEOLOGY

which would legitimate forms of injustice and any doctrine which is unwilling to resist such an ideology in the name of the gospel.

### Prayer for the People and Lord's Prayer

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. ## **Music Note**

One of the best known anthems in church music literature is Carl Mueller's "Create in Me a Clean Heart, O God". It is one of the best selling anthems of its publisher, G. Schirmer. It was written in 1941 and has been sung by Grace First Choirs for many years. The text is taken from Psalm 51: 10-13, and its meditative text is perfect for Ash Wednesday and any time in Lent.
