We will celebrate

HOLY COMMUNION

Sunday, Oct. 7 Sunday, Nov. 4 Some of you may ask, "Has our pastor gone bonkers? Why is she celebrating Halloween?" No, I'm not bonkers. Halloween is a celebration that has Christian origins. Further, it leads us directly into All Saints, a notable celebration of the Christian church.

So why, do I enjoy Halloween?

-Not because it has become a commercial holiday. Did you know that 25% of candy sales in the US are Halloween related? I do think the celebration of Halloween by some families is a bit over the top as they cater to their kids' expectations. Growing up poor in the country, we made our own costumes and trick or treated at the 3-4 neighboring homes before it got dark. And all our neighbors knew who did what the night before (Mischief Night on October 30) toilet papering of the trees. Four homes with only three of them having kids is a giveaway situation. How gracious our neighbors were!

- Halloween is a great night to pretend – to try on another persona. Could I be the ghost, the princess, or the witch? Healthy persons ask themselves that question every once in a while. Who else could I be? Are we stuck with the definition of me, especially in the church setting, or can we allow each other to grow - maybe the preacher is funnier than credited by the dour expectations, or the person in the pew has a hidden talent? The church is a place where we are expected to grow spiritually, to grow mentally, to grow emotionally, and to grow in maturity. How can we honor that in each other? Can we 'let' someone try on a new committee or do we just assume they are Mr. or Ms. Usher because it's how we have known them for years?

-Hallowe'en (using the proper English spelling) is derived as a name from the celebration of All Hallows Evening. All Hallows Evening was when the church focused on summoning the presence of the spirits who had gone on to their heavenly reward. Indeed in olden days, the church members summoned the spirits of the gone-on ones to be with us for guidance. The olden days were in the Middle Ages;

> the phenomenon of memory and the ability of spirits to return was reflective of the age. Yet, even today we wisely say of the deceased that their spirit lives on - indeed it does, even or maybe especially in this congregation. FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

I have shared with you in the past month's devotions from two books that I read daily, *My Utmost for His Highest* by Oswald Chambers and *Have you Considered* by Julie Von Vett. I would like to share a reading of the devotional out of the later for this month. It gave me something to think about.

Our teeth not only show amazing design but reveal God's signature at a microscopic level.

Enamel is the bright white crown part of the tooth. It is the hardest living tissue in the human body. This is why, long after even the bones of buried animals have disintegrated, the teeth often remain. This hard enamel shell protects the tooth's life support system – the blood vessels and nerves. It is the design of enamel that allows us to bite, tear and chew our food.

But, perhaps, the most stunning thing about our teeth is buried within the enamel. The enamel is designed using fish-shaped rods on a microscopic level. This shape interlocks the enamel crystals giving them incredible strength – like nuts threaded onto a bolt. It's very curious that the cross-sections of these structures are fish-shaped. From the earliest historical times, the symbol that Christians used to identify themselves with Jesus Christ was the symbol of the fish. Jesus Christ called us to be "fishers of men" and our very teeth are made from "rods" that look like "fish!" Coincidence, or was it God's design? You be the judge!

Goldsmith, Jr. As many of you know, Dan was an ardent supporter of music in this church. He sang in the choir, and he and Kerry played handbells for many years. He also donated several octaves of hand chimes so that we could expand to notes we had not previously been able to play. Dan provided us with various pieces of equipment to make our work easier.

Dan and Kerry were responsible for commissioned music this church will enjoy for many years to come. They provided us with commissions for the 2014 anniversary of Grace First: a choral anthem, "Great Are You Lord", composed by Allen Pote, published by Hope Publishers; a handbell composition, "God of Amazing Grace", composed by Cathy Moklebust, published by Choristers Guild.
