FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

What do you see in your clouds?

"Behold, He cometh with clouds." Rev. 1:7

In the Bible, clouds are always connected with God. Clouds are those sorrows or sufferings or providences, within or without our personal lives, which seem to dispute the rule of God. It is by those very clouds that the Spirit of God is teaching us how to walk by faith. If there were no clouds, we should have no faith. "The clouds are the dust of our Father's feet." The clouds are a sign that He is there. What a revelation it is to know that sorrow and bereavement and suffering are the clouds that come along with God! God cannot come near without clouds; He does not come in clear shining.

It is not true to say that God wants to teach us something in our trials; through every cloud He brings, He wants us to *unlearn* something. His purpose in the cloud is to simplify our belief until our relationship to Him is exactly that of a child – God and my own soul. Is the relationship between myself and God getting simpler than it has ever been?

There is a connection between the strange providences of God and what we know of Him, and we have to learn to interpret the mysteries of life in the light of our knowledge of God. Unless we can look the darkest, blackest fact full in the face without damaging God's character, we do not yet know Him.

"They feared as they entered the cloud..." Is there anyone "save Jesus only" in your cloud? If so, it will get darker; you must get to the place where there is "no one any more save Jesus only."

MISSION & OUTREACH BACKPACK PROGRAM



Across the country, teachers and school nurses have found that in some instances, Monday morning comes and they are forced to compete against hunger for the attention of their students. More than 18 million children qualify for free or reduced price meals through the National School Lunch Program, the fuel that they need to get them through the week. What happens to these children when they go home over the weekend?

Churches all around the country have adopted this Backpack Program to meet the needs of the children.

Here is how it works:

A school is chosen to serve, and the school determines how many children are in need. We have partnered with Wright Elementary and will provide packs for several children. Last year we provided 22 packs per week.

Disposable backpacks are purchased for the children to hold the non-perishable foods. Each week the packs are filled with 3 daily servings for 2 days (the weekend)

The packs are dropped off at the school on Thursday or Friday, at which time the school Counselor gives backpacks to the children.

The Mission & Outreach Ministry is collecting the following items to fill backpacks (*individual packets only*):

Applesauce, Beans & Franks, Beef & Cheese Sticks, Beef Stew, Cereal Bars, Crackers, Fruit Cups, Graham Crackers, Granola Bars, Cereal Boxes, and Snack Items

Fruit Juice, Mac-n-Cheese, Oatmeal, Canned Vegetables, Peanut Butter & Jelly , Pudding Cups, Raisins, Trail Mix,

The Session addressed various procedural matters in 1955, including the matter of the minister of the church wearing a robe. This may have been prompted by an incident the previous summer when Mark Littleton was assisting a visiting minister in the pulpit.

As an elder tells it:

To Mark's great consternation, he looked down and saw that the minister had failed to zip up his fly. Mark, as he squirmed, exercised all the mental telepathy he possessed to alert the minister. He finally got his attention while the congregation was standing singing the last hymn before the sermon. The preacher eased behind the pulpit and, hidden from the view of the congregation, made the proper adjustment. This many have had nothing to do with ministers wearing robes in the pulpit, but the custom of wearing robes in our church was approved by the Session.
